Ōmaru Creek, Point England was once described as one of the most polluted waterways in Tāmaki Makaurau. TEPS members are working hard to change this and bring this lovely waterway back to its former beauty and vitality.

Three clean up events were held this year, in September, October and March. On 12 March 2023, a beautiful Sunday afternoon, 15 volunteers turned up and with them came three young children as well. The site covered was part of the Omaru Creek.

After signing up and a health and safety briefing, a volunteer commented on how professional this project was run. Equipped with pincers, gloves, hi viz vests, waders, and brand-new wheelbarrows, enthusiastic volunteers set off to the location. In groups of two and three, they made sure that they collected as much rubbish as they could and in the safety of a watchful partner.

Within an hour, a one cubic metre bag was nearly full and in addition, two rusty supermarket trolleys, a baby seat and a large aluminium frame door complete with glass intact. The sense of satisfaction of a mission accomplished was shared by all and the kids looked forward to their ice cream.
